Philip Gordon is National Security Advisor to Vice President Kamala Harris. He has previously served in a number of senior foreign policy positions in the U.S. government, including as White House Coordinator for the Middle East, North Africa, and the Gulf Region; Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs; and NSC Director for European Affairs.

Dr. Gordon has also held research and teaching positions at the Council on Foreign Relations, the Brookings Institution, the International Institute for Strategic

Studies, INSEAD, the German Council on Foreign Relations, SAIS, and RAND. Gordon has a Ph.D and MA in international relations from Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies and a BA from Ohio University.

He is the author of a number of books and monographs on international relations and foreign policy including, most recently, *Losing the Long Game: The False Promise of Regime Change in the Middle East* (2020) and has written frequently for *The New York Times, The Washington Post, Financial Times, Foreign Affairs, Foreign Policy, The Atlantic, Politico,* and other publications.
